The Street Breakfast Wednesday, June 21, 2023, sends the Pikes Peak Range Riders on their ride around Pikes Peak to promote the Pikes Peak or Bust Rodeo on July 13-16, 2023.

Location

The Street Breakfast is at the corner of Pikes Peak and Tejon in downtown Colorado Springs. Please refer to the map at the end of this guide for more details and parking information.

History

The first Street Breakfast dates back to 1936 when about 35 people got together and were served from a chuck wagon in front of Joe Reich's Swiss Chalet. When the Pikes Peak Range Riders made their first ride in 1949, they were looking for a place to start their ride

the next year and the Street Breakfast seemed like a perfect venue. During those days \$1.00 got you a breakfast of eggs and pancakes. And today you get the same breakfast for just \$5.00, which is a pretty good deal! Tradition is that the cost of the breakfast also includes a souvenir wooden token commemorating the event.

In the 1950s the Jaycees operated the Street Breakfast as a community event and in 1960, Sertoma took over the operation, and starting in 2016, The Pikes Peak Range Riders became the host of the breakfast.

Breakfast includes pancakes, syrup, scrambled eggs, orange juice, and coffee. Cooking and serving at the Street Breakfast for over 40 years have been volunteers from Fort Carson. Starting in 2019, US Air Force volunteers joined Fort Carson. Fort Carson Mounted Color Guard presents the United States and Colorado flags in front of the stage while the crowd removes their cowboy hats and sings the National Anthem.



Pikes Peak Range Riders

At 8:00 a.m., more than 160 Range Riders on horseback parade through downtown. At the corner of Pikes Peak and Cascade the Range Riders tip their hats as they pass the Pikes Peak Range Riders statue to show honor and respect for those Range Riders who have passed before them.



Entertainment

There will be live music provided by **Exit West** and the **Flying W Wranglers**. In addition, there will be a Trick Roper with roping lessons, Native American Dancers, and musical performances by the students of **The Colorado Springs Conservatory**.

The Flying W Wranglers have been a part of our western heritage for over 60 years, making them the world's second oldest western singing group. They have performed at the Street Breakfast for many years, singing songs about cowboy life on the trail delivered in the "wrangler style."

The Pikes Peak or Bust Rodeo **Girls of the West** and the **El Paso County Fair Queen** will be there to present on stage and greet the crowd.

Kids

The **Lil' Cowboys and Cowgirls Round Up** follows the departure of the Pikes Peak Range Riders. Parents can sign up their kids at the booth located at the NE corner of Pikes Peak and Tejon. Winners will receive great prizes provided by Boot Barn, Cavenders, Chick-fil-A, and Pikes Peak or Bust Rodeo. The **Kids Corral** will be handing out free gifts to our young attendees. You will find cowboy hats, scarfs, and sheriff badges.

What to Wear

Put on your jeans, boots, and cowboy hat; sit on bales of straw while enjoying a breakfast of pancakes and scrambled eggs. We have years of great weather, but please be prepared in case the Colorado weather changes.

Donations

Proceeds from the Street Breakfast benefit local military and their families. More than \$500,000 has been raised and donated over the last 50 years. All funds remain in the Colorado Springs community.

Fun Facts

It takes quite a bit to create a community breakfast for more than 8,000 hungry guests:

- 1,100 pounds of pancake batter
- 1,500 pounds of eggs
- 80 gallons of syrup
- 500 gallons of coffee
- 7,500 pints of milk
- 2,500 pints of juice
- 1,100 bales of hay... that is 2,200 when you count taking them off the truck and then putting them back on again.

Media Parking

The streets close at midnight on June 20th and media or personal vehicles must position their vehicles between midnight and 1:00 a.m. if you wish to be parked in the event area.

Street Closures

At midnight before the event, Tejon Street will be closed between Colorado Avenue and Kiowa Street, and Pikes Peak Avenue will be closed between Wahsatch Avenue and Cascade Avenue to prepare for the breakfast.

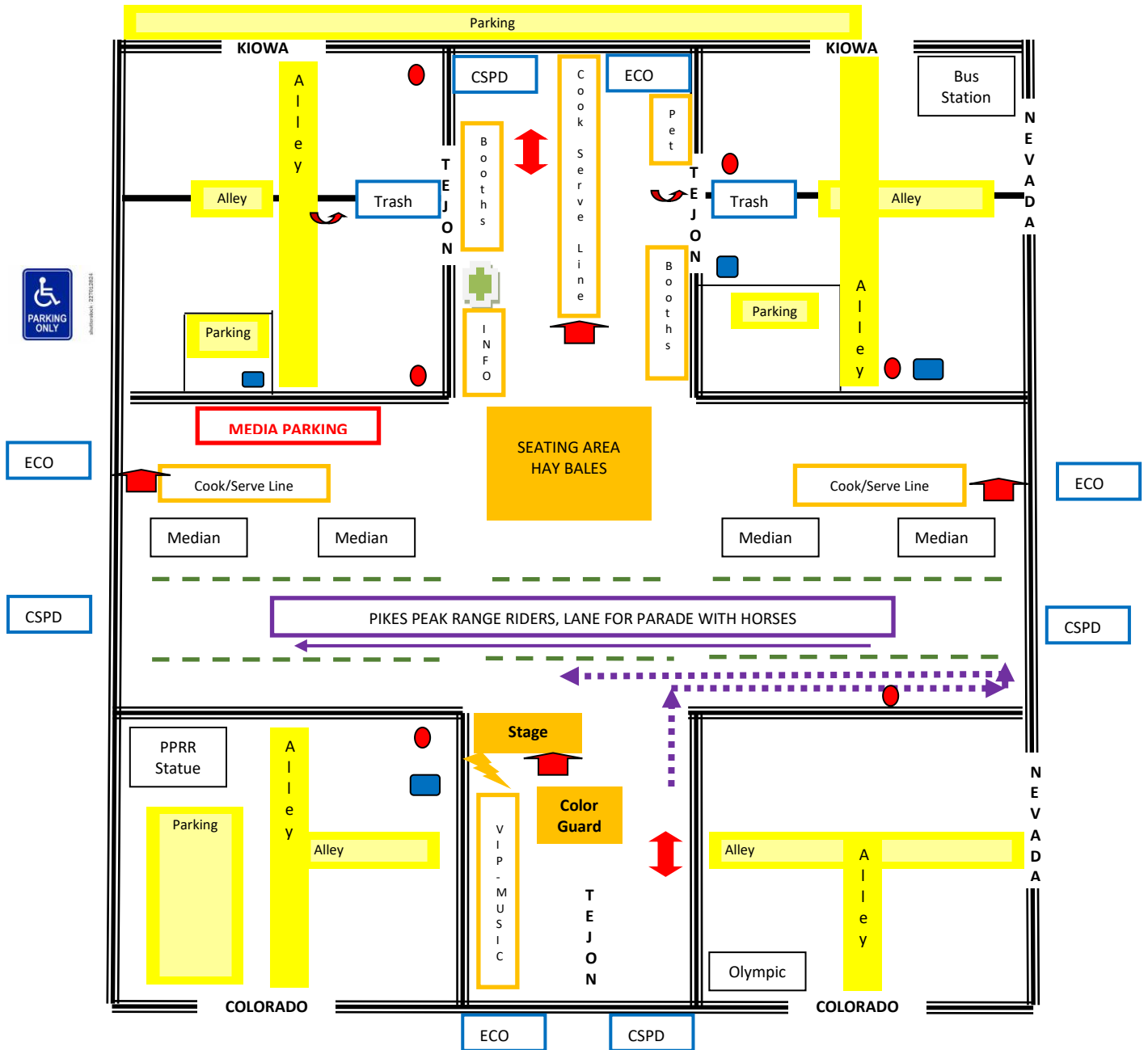












Tickets/Tokens
